Sermon Notes February 10, 2019 "Is Anything Too Wonderful for the Lord?" Genesis 18:1-15, 21:1-7

Looking through the New Testament, I can find only two places where laughter is explicitly mentioned. The first instance is Matt. 9:24, and its parallels, where Jesus is called to the home of the ruler of the synagogue and it's no laughing matter. His little daughter has just died and when Jesus tells the grieving father that the girl will live, the crowd broke out in a cynical laughter of disbelief. The second place where laughter is found in the New Testament is Luke 6:21. But here we have the laughter that comes from what I would call reversal. Here Jesus says, "Blessed are you who weep, for you shall laugh."

Now our Old Testament scripture texts remind us that Sarah had reason enough to weep. At first, we see a cynical laughter that God would promise to give Abraham and Sarah a child at their advanced ages. But when it does happen, we see the second type of laughter. Is anything too wonderful for the Lord?

In my experience, about the last people to have faith and believe this are the pastors and church leaders. They are the most shocked when there is an intrusion. There is a lot of atheism behind much of our ministry. The sermons that are preached and the programs that we plan don't have to have a divine intrusion to work. The type of pastoral care that we give doesn't require any miracles to occur.

I would like to leave you this morning with a question that I want you to mull over this week. What do we need to be able to hear Sarah laugh, both as individuals and a church? I know it can be a very scary question. I'm sure that having a baby while she was in her 90's was no picnic for Sarah but it led to blessing for the whole world. In like manner, for us to hear Sarah laugh could mean change, but also blessing beyond all measure. So, what will it take for us to hear Sarah laugh? After all, is anything too wonderful for the Lord? Amen.
